Main Presentation: This month we welcome Scott Mobley. Scott is a US Navy Officer (Retired) who earned his Phd from the University of Wisconsin working with John Hall at the La Follette Center. Scott will be providing a presentation from his thesis and book; *Major Management Changes in the Navy in the late 19th Century*.

During the late 19th century, the U.S. Navy experienced a phenomenal metamorphosis, both technologically and professionally. Casting aside values inherited from the age of wood and sail, progressive naval officers forged a new profession built upon steam, steel, and strategy. However, this professional transformation was not a smooth process, as competing "cultures of advocacy" vied to shape the Navy's future. Scott's talk will recount these struggles, highlighting Wisconsin's surprising role in helping to construct the modern naval profession.
