Main Presentation: We are excited and honored to kickoff our 2024 – 2025 campaign with a presentation by David Maraniss. David will be speaking on his 2004 book, "They Marched into Sunlight: War and Peace, Vietnam and America, October 1967. The book centers around the Battle of Ong Thanh and a protest at the University of Wisconsin–Madison. The 2005 documentary film Two Days in October is based on the book and aired as part of the PBS series American Experience, winning a Peabody Award. In the UK, it was broadcast by BBC Four as How Vietnam Was Lost as part of the channel's Storyville series. David Maraniss was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize for History in 2004 and won the J. Anthony Lukas Book Prize that same year. Other books by David Maraniss include; Path Lit by Lightning: The Life of Jim Thorp, What It Takes to Be #1: Vince Lombardi on Leadership, Clemente: The Passion and Grace of Baseballs Last Hero and Rome 1960: The Olympics That Changed the World.
